PITTSBURGH, PA (Oct. 8, 2025) — Mission of Mercy Pittsburgh (MOMPGH) announced today that Brandi Miller has been named the organization’s new executive director.

Miller shows more than 13 years of distinguished leadership in the nonprofit sector. She is renowned for her ability to drive substantial organizational growth and for building dynamic, high-performing teams, as well as for her dedication to developing innovative solutions that address critical community needs.

Miller’s extensive experience includes seven years as the executive director of the Literacy Council of Southwestern PA (2018-2025), where she led initiatives in community relations, fundraising, program development, strategic planning and partnership cultivation, as well as oversaw all staff and volunteers. Prior to her tenure at the Literacy Council, Miller served for three years as the marketing and sales manager for the Washington Area Federal Credit Union (2015-2018), where she was responsible for the development of advertising campaigns, production of promotional materials and coordination of key events.

Her earlier roles include serving as senior district executive for the Boy Scouts of America (Scouting America), acting as liaison for Pittsburgh, Beaver County, Greene County and Washington County. Miller continues to demonstrate her commitment to service as past president and treasurer of the Rotary Club of Washington County, treasurer of the CYS Advisory Board, board member of the United States Selective Service and active contributor to the Washington County Human Trafficking and Washington County and Greene County STOP Advisory Boards.

In addition to being honored as the 2022 United Way Volunteer of the Year, Miller received the 2025 Liberty Bell Award and the 2022 Washington County Athena Young Professional Leadership Award.

Mission of Mercy Pittsburgh 2025

[Mission of Mercy Pittsburgh](#) will hold its annual free dental, vision and hearing clinic on Friday, Oct. 24, and Saturday, Oct. 25, at the David L. Lawrence Convention Center. The clinic is open to adults and children ages 2 and older. There are no eligibility requirements. Doors will open at 6 a.m. daily and close when capacity is reached. Patients will be seen on a first-come, first-served basis.

In 2024, MOMPdGH served 1,676 patients and conducted 9,374 dental procedures. Additional services provided in 2024 included conducting 693 eye and 402 hearing exams and distributing 552 free pairs of eyeglasses and 586 free hearing aids. All told, MOMPdGH delivered \$2.37 million in services last year with the help of 1,978 volunteers.

Since its founding in 2017, MOMPdGH has delivered \$9.2 million in free care to 8,941 patients.

More Volunteers Needed

Dental volunteers, including dentists, nurse practitioners and hygienists, are still needed for this year's clinic. Many dental volunteers can receive up to three hours of Continuing Education credits for their work with MOMPdGH. To learn more or to register as a volunteer, visit MOMPgh.org/volunteer.
